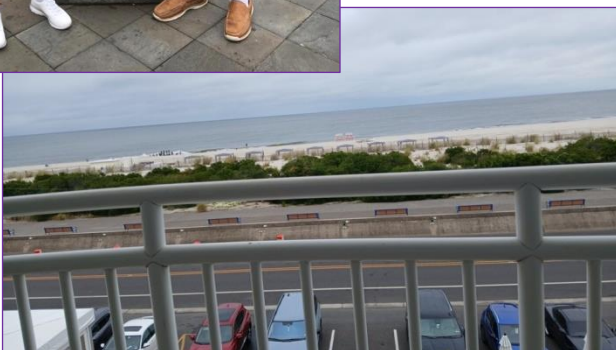

The ride started at 9 AM from Half Pint Creamery in McSherrystown. We rode to Gettysburg Half Pint Creamery about 18 miles, and arrived there about the time they opened at 11 AM.



Note: There were very few if any places to stop along the way so we brought water/snacks as we required. There were no restrooms at the Gettysburg Half Pint but we stopped at the Wellspan facility about 15 miles out. New Oxford and McSherrystown Half



Pints had rest rooms. (McSherrystown would NOT be open yet at the start) Total ride was 40 miles... ..expected return time was approx. 2 PM.

This was a lot of fun. We did some back roads, and rode around the battlefield. I also had a chance to talk to some cyclists that I hadn't met before.
